When CSHA can instantly compile a list of riders or number of hours equestrians use a particular area or trail it is justification to those governmental agencies maintaining trails.

<u>**Trail Trials**</u> –An obstacle course competition that tests the trail skills of horse and rider. Courses are several miles in length and reflect the diversity of California trials whether they are located on a ranch, public park, wilderness, beach, desert or urban setting.
